Catholics For an End to the War in Iraq

Catholics for an End to the War in Iraq is a national movement of Catholics who are advocating immediate action to end U.S. military action in Iraq. We call on our leaders to follow a three point plan for success:

Diplomacy: *Work to bring together Iraq's warring factions for a multi-party peace conference, as well as efforts to involve Iraq's international neighbors in the peace process;* **Redevelopment:** *Provide funding and other support for reconstruction to be done by Iraqis in ways that benefit Iraqis;* **Responsible Withdrawal:** *Begin immediate cessation of offensive U.S. military operations and withdrawal of combat troops, and commit to not having a long-term U.S. presence in Iraq.*
