

"One Lord, One Faith, One Baptism: An Introduction to Infant Baptism in the Roman Catholic Church" (17 minutes; Diocese of Rockville Centre, 2009) is a good video for use in baptismal preparation sessions. The program features Fr. Nick Zientarski, who unpacks the meaning of the Sacrament of Baptism. Following the parts of the ritual Fr. Nick explains the symbols of Baptism, the role of godparents, the profession of faith and the importance of ongoing faith formation. Throughout the video three couples share their own real-life joys and challenges of living out the grace of Baptism at home in their "domestic church" and in their local parish communities

"Don't Drink the Holy Water!: Big Al and Annie Go to Mass" (50 minutes; Ligouri Publications, 2010) is a video that accompanies a 64 page hardcover book that explains the Mass for young children. In the video live excerpts of the Mass are shown, accompanied by a narrative from Fr. Joe Kempf. After each segment a prayer from the book is read by a child who is learning from Fr. Joe and his puppet friends Al and Annie. Parts of the Mass are covered in very short segments that help children understand how each piece of the ritual enhances the prayerful order and flow of the liturgy.
