

Become One Body One Spirit in Christ

Suggested Usage for the Interactive DVD

The *Become One Body One Spirit in Christ* Interactive DVD is an excellent resource for parishes, parish staffs, committees, parishioners and others who are interested in preparing for the new Third Edition of the Roman Missal. The Missal will begin to be used the first Sunday of Advent 2011. Until then parishes and dioceses have been called by the USCCB to engage in catechesis on the Order of the Mass and aspects of the new translation. Using a resource such as the *Become One Body One Spirit in Christ* DVD can assist in that catechesis.

The DVD contains a variety of types of resources that can be used for different levels of interest. This document offers suggestions on using the resources in the DVD based on a series of **Topics**, found in the first column of the table below. For each topic there are three suggested **Levels of Content** offered in the next column:

| Level 1: | Resources from the DVD that could be used for introductory information or general knowledge. (Video resources list length in minutes) |
| Level 2: | Resources from the DVD for those who want further enrichment. These resources should be used in addition to the Level 1 resources. |
| Level 3: | Resources from the DVD for parish or committee leaders, or those who want even more background. These resources should be used in addition to the Level 1 and 2 resources. |

Finally, there is a **Suggested Audience** column. Parish leaders can use these suggestions to gather the various audience members and show portions of the DVD as a group, or allow individuals to view portions or read essays prior to gathering for discussion. Parish leaders can then facilitate conversations around such questions as:

“How does this information change our understanding of the Mass?”

“How do the upcoming changes impact those we serve?”

“What do we need to do to further prepare for Advent 2011?”

In addition, parishes should consider including any reflection questions or summaries of responses in their bulletins or on their websites, allowing for those who cannot gather together. *Please note* all three columns are only suggestions and particular groups may find the DVD beneficial for catechesis on other topics, may use different combinations of videos for their groups, or may use the DVD for additional audiences. Hopefully this document will help parish leaders begin to think creatively about using this DVD.

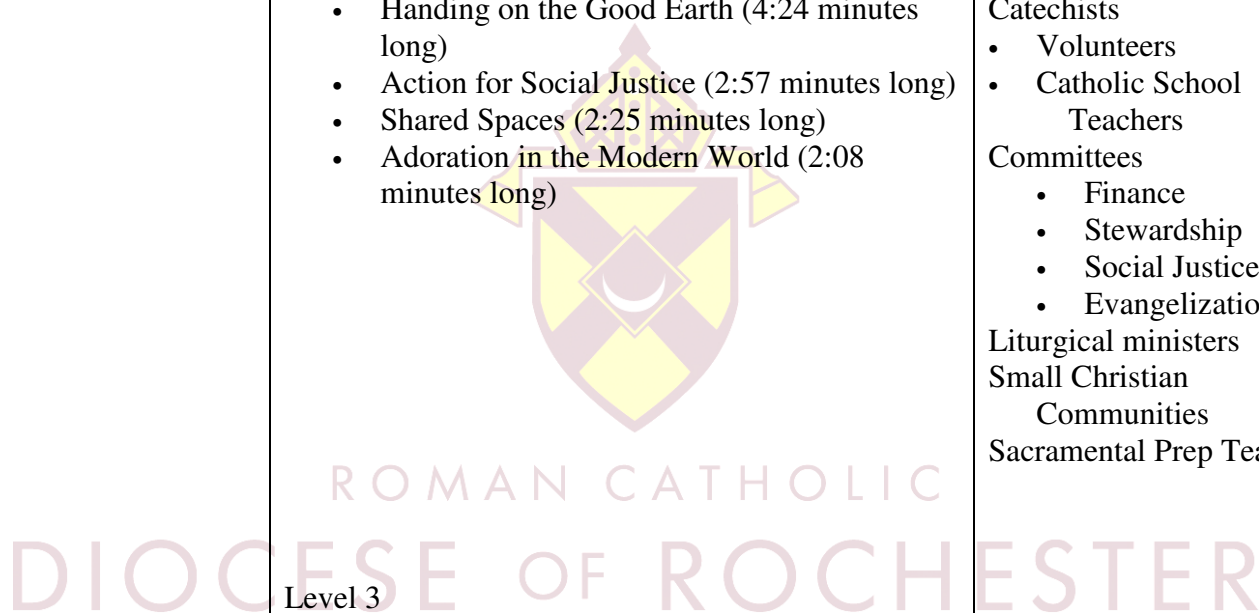
