- cherishes and tends them in a responsible and accountable manner,
- shares them in justice and love with all, and
- returns them with increase to the Lord.

IV. How is stewardship a spirituality?

- Stewardship is a practical spirituality, the connection between the spiritual and the material.
- "Stewardship is a spirituality a way of holiness for people who spend much of their lives earning money, spending money, and worrying about money."
- "What are you doing with your life?"
- "Stewardship is an overriding theological and spiritual concept that integrates much of what we are already doing in our dioceses and parishes."
- Lord, what do You want me to do to fulfill Your will for Your Church?"

V. How do we "live" stewardship as a spirituality?

- "Stewardship is what we do after we say 'We Believe'."
- "Hold back nothing of yourselves for yourselves so that He who gives Himself totally to you may receive you totally." (St. Francis of Assisi)
