# **Stewardship**

- A steward is defined as a disciple of Jesus who "receives God's gifts gratefully, cultivates them responsibly, shares them lovingly in justice with others and returns them with increase to the Lord."
- Stewardship is a way of life that comes from seeing everything as a gift from God.
- The disciple is motivated by faith and a deep sense of gratitude, flowing from their faith, to a greater sharing of his/her time, talent and treasure with the Church and other worthy causes. Time, talent, and treasure are all shared as a **gift**, in a planned, proportionate, thankful, and sacrificial manner.



## **Three Types of Members**

Engaged:

Not engaged:

social attendance, but feel little connection or ownership

Rarely present or

Regularly present, but "C.A.V.E. dwelling"

- Ask of everything we plan and do, "How does this build engagement?"

  "How does this welcome people?"
- Re-survey in two years to measure change


# **Welcome and Hospitality**

that gathers on Sunday.










