Special Circumstances: Migrant ministry. This is one of the largest geographic largest planning groups with consequently large distances between some parishes.

Comments: Personnel figures are as of July 1, 2003. Sacramental and household information is 2002 data. These six parishes are in a single cluster. The projected number of priests does not necessarily mean full time priest pastors. Since all pastoral leadership positions are open to pastoral administrators, a "projected priest" could be a sacramental minister who serves with a pastoral administrator on either a full time or part time basis. Currently the three priests are full time. However, during the next five years one of those priests will be a part-time sacramental minister, essentially providing weekend Masses.
