Next Steps for Cryptocurrency Legislation

The bill on cryptocurrency that our Diocesan Public Policy Committee is supporting has **passed** the New York State Assembly!

This legislation places a **two-year moratorium** on **crypto-mining operations** housed in fossil-fuel burning power plants. This process uses an enormous amount of electricity and dumps heated water into waterways.

As this new industry evolves, its environmental impact isn't known. This proposed moratorium would require the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation to perform a full environmental impact assessment and research the industry's effect on New York's ability to meet our climate goals.

Standing with Mothers and Children for Mother's Day



The **Pregnant Workers Fairness Act** (S. 1486) would make the workplace safer for pregnant workers and their unborn children by requiring employers to provide pregnant employees with reasonable accommodations. Common requests made by pregnant women include a chair for jobs that require long periods of standing up, a modified schedule, light duty for jobs that require heavy lifting, being able to carry a bottle of water, or permission to take additional breaks to use the restroom or drink water.
