- 11/28/21 1st Sunday of Advent (Lk 21:25-28, 34-36): Life is full of "anxieties" and uncertainties for the future. "The purpose of the Synod, and therefore of this consultation, is not to produce documents, but 'to plant dreams, draw forth prophesies and visions, allow hope to be nourished, inspire trust, bind up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken a dawn of hope, learn from one another, and create a bright resourcefulness that will enlighten minds, warm hearts, give strength to our hands." - 12/5/21 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Advent (Lk 3:1-6): John the Baptist went out to all the region proclaiming to "prepare the way of the Lord." Synod theme #2 Speaking Out invites us to speak with courage and *parrhesia* (candidly), that is, integrating freedom, truth, and charity. When and how do we profess our faith in the world? - 12/12/21 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent (Lk 3:10-18): John the Baptist listened to the plea of the people recently baptized who asked, "What can I do?" Synod theme #5 Co-Responsibility in the Mission says that "Synodality is at the service of the Church's mission, in which all her members are called to participate. Since we are all missionary disciples, how is each Baptized person called to be a leader in the mission?" - 12/19/21 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent (Lc 1:39-45): Mary visits her cousin, Elizabeth who recognizes the blessing and favor God bestowed upon Mary, blessed among all women because of her "fiat"/acceptance to God's will. Synod theme #9 Discerning and Deciding reminds us that "In a synodal style, decisions are made through discernment, based on a consensus that flows from the common obedience to the Spirit".
