With sincere gratitude, I am pleased to share this Annual Report for our 2020-2021 Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA). This report provides information about how CMA donations are lighting the path for those in need, for your parish, and for our Diocese.

Following the theme of *Christ, Our Light*, you joined with nearly 22,000 individuals and families in giving \$6.4 million to help our Church, your pastor, your parish community, and people in the most dire need to navigate through these challenging times.

Through the COVID-19 pandemic, when our faith was particularly vital amid unbearable suffering and loss and the unprecedented shuttering of our community, the CMA provided crucial support so that we could continue our community of faith, supporting virtual, online ministry and evangelization in every corner of the Diocese. # CMA 2020-2021 Highlights

## Information Technology

- Implemented several new cybersecurity software platforms, including CrowdStrike®, to protect parishes, schools, and Catholic Charities agencies against data breaches
- Installed hundreds of cameras and the necessary wiring across parishes and schools to support virtual ministry
- Extended networks to church buildings to allow for live-streaming of Masses
- Implemented new hardware and software to allow for increased flexibility and disaster recovery for parishes
- Assisted Catholic schools in

## Seminarian, Deacon & Pastoral Leader Education, Ministry and Support

- Educated 7 seminarians at St. John's Seminary, Brighton,

MA and in Rome

- Educated 10 men in the Diaconate program at St. Bernard's School of Theology and Ministry

## Pastoral Services

- Advocacy and education through the Office of Life Issues
- Campus Ministry stipends to support important outreach taking place on college campuses throughout the Diocese
- Support to parishes through transitions, including an online parish directory of offerings, weekly Mass data,

demographic reports, change-management resources, and pastoral council resources

- Sacramental ministry and outreach to the Migrant Centers – a significant source of spiritual life in our Diocese

## **Evangelization & Catechesis**

- Support and organization of 18 Confirmation celebrations in April 2021 and 17 celebrations in August 2020.
- Diocesan-wide summer family faith journey that connected families in at-home faith experiences
- National speakers who provided information and advice on COVID-19 quarantine and mental well-being, especially among teens
- Weekly video conferencing with catechetical leaders throughout the fiscal year
- Development and publication of *The Family Zone*, a lectionary-based newsletter/playlist for families
- Theology on Tapas (Young Adult Virtual Cooking Series)
- Support and organization of 3 *Hands of Christ* Award ceremonies
- Catholic Scouting Recognition Ceremony
- Facilitated the “Called & Gifted” program of the Catherine of Siena Institute to lead young adults to become more intentional disciples of Christ
- Discounted online Pre-Cana course during pandemic shutdown
- Updated resources and materials for RCIA training
- Virtual workshops and trainings for catechetical leaders, including 3 “Days of Reflection” and 6 presentations around the *Directory of Catechesis* document published by the Vatican
